

Common Application for Summer Study Overview

The Common Application for Summer Study is one of Equity Arc's flagship initiatives and embodies our commitment to collective action. Equity Arc champions a collective approach, working with like-minded partners to increase the impact of equitable initiatives. Guided by collaboration and information sharing, the Common Application creates access to essential summer study opportunities and supports musicians from backgrounds historically underrepresented in classical music by removing barriers through the application and decision-making process. Eligible musicians can use this tool to apply to multiple partner festivals through one application and one audition for free.

The Common Application began with 11 partners, each of whom has prioritized equitable practices and opportunities. Now in its third season, the Common Application has 19 participating programs. Each year, Equity Arc works with our partners to evaluate this joint initiative and identify opportunities for improvement. Our partners' collaboration in this review process ensures that the initiative evolves, offering a better experience for our partners and musicians. Their willingness to share practices and to communicate openly promotes growth.





One of our key priorities this season was providing greater guidance for musicians as they choose programs. Through expanding avenues of communication between musicians and programs, we facilitate opportunities to learn and find the best fit.

The impact of the Common Application is made possible through the generosity and collaboration of our partners. The programs that partner in the Common Application have existing institutional commitments to equity. By working collaboratively with partners who share our values, we continue to move the needle of equity work. Each partnering program commits to offering at least one full-tuition scholarship to an Equity Arc applicant and commits to continued collaboration. Through collective action, we expand our impact, set a precedent through working together, and empower musicians and their families to access important opportunities in their musical development.





Applicants by Program




Enrolled Participants by Program






Applicant Constituency Groups








Geographic Impact


The 2024 Common Application for Summer Study reached applicants across over half of the United States

The Ascent International Summer Festivals are tailored for the serious string student. Beginning in 2025, all programs will take place on the idyllic campus of Western Reserve Academy in Hudson, OH. Ascent goes beyond the practice room to nurture the growth of musicians aged 13 to 30 in all aspects.



Musicians at Ascent work with exceptional faculty who represent some of the finest institutions in the country, including Juilliard, Peabody, Cleveland Institute of Music, the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and CCM, and Eastman School of Music. The Grammy winning Catalyst Quartet serves as Ouartet-in-Residence for the festival.




Boston University Tanglewood Institute

The Boston University Tanglewood Institute is designed to help musicians become as dynamic and versatile an artist as possible. Musicians will hone their craft in a small group setting, focusing on the fundamentals of technique and musicianship. Through masterclasses, lessons, and academic classes with new friends, musicians will have an unforgettable summer.

Through BUTI's relationship with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, students have the opportunity to learn and grow through intensive programming in the presence of some of the world's greatest music professionals and teachers.
BUTI's faculty include members of some of the country's finest orchestras and chamber ensembles, and many teach at prestigious conservatories and universities. BUTI students can attend almost all of the BSO's and Tanglewood Music Center's concerts each summer.



Green Mountain Chamber Music Festival provides an intensive four-week chamber music festival for strings (violin, viola, cello) and chamber music study. The program places special emphasis on community engagement with its extensive outreach performance program for students, including two all-day Quartet Hops around the greater Burlington Area and numerous 'pop-up' concerts in local businesses over the course of the festival.

Green Mountain fosters a supportive and nurturing environment for all its students so that all they may

hone playing skills, improve personal practice habits and network with faculty, guest artists and other students alike, making lasting and invaluable connections in their lives as musicians. Green Mountain students leave the festival and enter the world as the next generation of ambassadors for chamber music and the arts at-large.



Greenwood Music Camp offers a unique experience for high level chamber music playing in a warm, noncompetitive environment. All students participate in chamber music, orchestra and chorus, and they are challenged and encouraged to work hard to discover the great reward of intensive, well-focused learning.

Students are involved everyday in fun, communitybuilding activities like soccer and frisbee games, charades, a talent show, a scavenger hunt, dances, and a trip to the Cummington Fair. The 80-acre



From across the nation and around the world, artistic students ages 8-18 convene at Interlochen to expand their capacity in music, theatre, dance, creative writing, visual arts, interdisciplinary arts, and film.

Through daily classes, enriching electives, and frequent performances, Interlochen students explore the full breadth of the arts, pursue creative breakthroughs, and forge lifelong cross-cultural friendships. Immersed in a multidisciplinary artistic environment, young creatives find reflection, rejuvenation, and inspiration on Interlochen's scenic 1,200-acre wooded campus.

The Kinhaven Music School is a unique residential summer music camp in the rolling green hills of Weston, Vermont. With an emphasis on a collaborative, non-competitive environment, Kinhaven's spirit inspires spontaneous music making, musical growth, and lasting friendships. Musicians who study at Kinhaven can immerse themselves in music in idyllic Vermont. In addition to non-musical activities, afternoons offer practice hours for those who wish for a more intensive experience.

Luzerne Music Center invites more than 150 talented musicians from all over the world to its campus each summer. Each day is filled with musical activities, with time dedicated to recreational activities as well! Focusing on a comprehensive musical experience, students have

chamber music, orchestra rehearsals, theory classes, and lessons in addition to concerts and group classes. The schedule is designed to be musically immersive and enriching.

Faculty at Luzerne have dynamic performing and teaching careers, and are committed to student growth and musical flourishing. In addition to technical and musical development, many also prioritize developing practice skills, goal setting, and posture. Everyone at Luzerne shares a vision to learn, foster, and grow a musical voice.




Madeline Island is the perfect retreat-like setting to immerse in chamber music studies with some of the top chamber music groups in the world! Their 2024 faculty included the Harlem Quartet, Brooklyn Rider, Arianna String Quartet, American String Quartet and members of Brentano Quartet, Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, and more. Madeline Island Chamber Music is a small program with fewer than 50 students participating, creating a tight-knit, supportive community.

The University of Maryland's National Orchestral Institute + Festival brings together aspiring orchestral musicians from across the country for a month of dynamic music-making and professional exploration. In 2024 NOI+F embarked on a full orchestra tour to the Ravinia Festival outside of Chicago to perform Mahler's Symphony no. 1 and Gabriela Ortiz's Antrópolis in a main stage concert led by NOI+F Music Director Marin Alsop.



The National Repertory Orchestra is a preeminent intensive summer music festival developing diverse, thoughtful and socially conscious musicians through experiential learning. Young musicians from around the world meet in Breckenridge, Colorado, each summer for 8 intensive weeks of orchestral study under the baton of Music Director Michael Stern and world-renowned guest conductors.

The NRO offers more repertoire than any other festival, with multiple full programs performed each week of the festival. With programming ranging from the cornerstones of western classical



LOCATION: Washington DC AGE RANGE: 15-20




The National Symphony Orchestra Summer Music Institute is an intensive four-week program focusing on musical development and the skills needed to become a true citizen artist in the 21st century. The program takes place at The Kennedy Center in Washington, DC, and provides performance opportunities, private lessons, chamber music coachings, side-by-side orchestra rehearsals, and masterclasses and workshops. This holistic approach to musical development ensures that students perform at the highest level and are prepared to serve their communities through music.

NSOSMI's faculty are musicians of the National Symphony Orchestra, one of the preeminent ensembles in the country. In addition to individual and ensemble study, students attend NSO rehearsals and performances and are also exposed to internationally renowned conductors, soloists, and musicians.

LOCATION: New York City + Tour AGE RANGE: 14-17 and 16-19



Each summer, Carnegie Hall's Weill Music Institute brings together the brightest young players from across the country to form the National Youth Orchestra of the United States of America. Following a multi-week training residency with leading professional orchestra musicians, these remarkable teenagers embark on a tour to some of the great music capitals of the world while serving as dynamic music ambassadors.


NYO2 is an intensive program that allows young artists to immerse themselves in their craft, learning alongside peers from some of the most esteemed professionals in the field. The program is in residence at Purchase College, SUNY, 30 miles north of New York City. The program concludes with a performance in Carnegie Hall's Stern Auditorium/Perelman Stage.






